

From Your Pastor's Heart

GOOD THINGS FROM A GOOD MAN—It is both a great privilege and a great responsibility to be a father. Good fathers work hard to provide good things for their families. Near the end of King David's life, he was wrapping up some things. He had ruled over Israel for forty years and as his life was drawing to a close, he had two major things on his mind—the success of his son, Solomon, and the building of the temple. God didn't allow David to build it (I Chronicles 28:3), but He did allow David to gather materials for its construction. And did David ever gather materials! He said he prepared for the house of God "with all my might" (I Chron. 28:2). What are the good things David gave us in this passage?

The first one is a **good choice**. All kinds of things called for David's attention—many of which were legitimate—but he had made a choice. He would not set his affection on lesser things. He would set it on God and His house (I Chron. 29:3). David knew if he didn't control his affections, they would control him. We must understand that there are some things that we should not love at all, and there are some things that we should love a lot less than we do. If we don't take charge of our affections, they will carry us away. The reason so many churches are in decline is most church members can't say what David said. They haven't "set their affections" on the house of God.


No doubt, society has drastically changed. No longer is there a general attitude of friendliness toward the church. But the main problem in our churches is not the attitude of the world. It is the attitude of church members who basically say: "We won't make the church our priority. We will put anything and everything above the church, and whatever we have left, we will give to the church."

The second good thing David gives us is the **good reason for his good choice**. Why did David love God's house more than other things? The answer is in the words "my God" (I Chron. 29:3). David loved

the house of God because God had become his God. How does God become our God? This doesn't happen automatically. The sin that separates us from God must be removed, and it can only be removed when its penalty has been paid.

The good news of the gospel is Jesus paid that penalty. We would do well to hear Jesus speaking similar words about His church like David did about the temple. In Ephesians 5:25-27 we see Jesus set His affection on the church so much that He gave His life for her.

Finally, David gives us the **good result of his good choice**. David's good choice led him to act. David not only collected materials for the temple, but he also gave his "special treasure of gold and silver" to help build the temple. We have the tendency to restrict love for God and His house to just a feeling. We think it's possible to love God and His house without doing anything. If we say we love God and never do anything to show it, we really don't love Him at all. We just think we do. Are you showing by your life and actions that you love the Lord and that you will serve Him every way you can? We cannot expect real revival until we do.
